STATUTORY AUTHORITY TO CLOSE SESSION, General Provisions Article, §3-305(b) (check all that apply):

- (1) **Personnel matters:** to discuss the appointment, employment, assignment, promotion, discipline, demotion, compensation, removal, resignation, or performance evaluation of appointees, employees, or officials over whom this public body has jurisdiction; or any other personnel matter that affects one or more specific individuals;
- (2) **Privacy or reputation:** to protect the privacy or reputation of individuals concerning a matter not related to public business;
- (3) **Real property acquisition:** to consider the acquisition of real property for a public purpose and matters directly related thereto;
- (4) **Business location:** to consider a matter that concerns the proposal for a business or industrial organization to locate, expand, or remain in the State;
- (5) **Investment of public funds:** to consider the investment of public funds;
- (6) **Marketing of public securities:** to consider the marketing of public securities;
- (7) **Legal advice:** to consult with counsel to obtain legal advice on a legal matter;
- (8) **Pending or potential litigation:** to consult with staff, consultants, or other individuals about pending or potential litigation;
- (9) **Collective bargaining:** to conduct collective bargaining negotiations or consider matters that relate to the negotiations;
- (10) **Public security:** to discuss public security, if the public body determines that public discussion would constitute a risk to the public or to public security, including: (i) the deployment of fire and police services and staff; and (ii) the development and implementation of emergency plans;
- (11) **Scholastic, licensing, and examination:** to prepare, administer, or grade a scholastic, licensing, or qualifying examination;
- (12) **Investigate proceeding regarding criminal conduct:** to conduct or discuss an investigative proceeding on actual or possible criminal conduct;
- (13) **Other law:** to comply with a specific constitutional, statutory, or judicially imposed requirement that prevents public disclosures about a particular proceeding or matter;
- (14) **Procurement:** before a contract is awarded or bids are opened, to discuss a matter directly related to a negotiating strategy or the contents of a bid or proposal, if public discussion or disclosure would adversely impact the ability of the public body to participate in the competitive bidding or proposal process.
